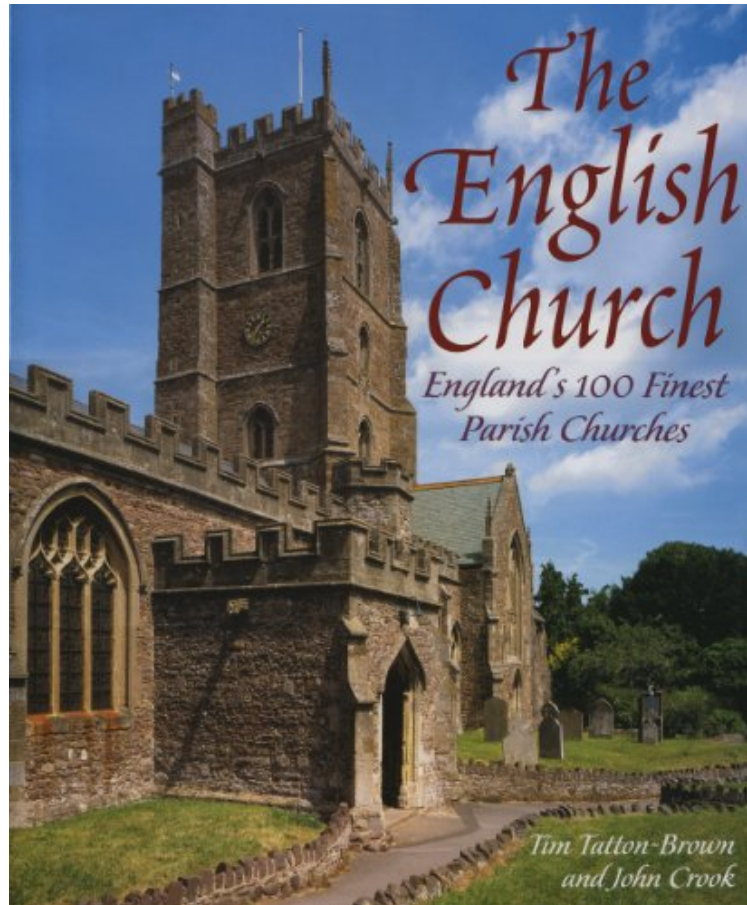

The map and text don't give directions to these churches but if you can find the town you'll likely also find that it's church is the biggest building in town and easy to spot. There will be at least two pages of text for each of the churches, mixed in with several beautiful photos of the building and detail shots of interest for each. The text will cover the history and is interesting in itself.The book is well worth owning whether or not you have any religious convictions.
