Within the series Regions without frontiers, the individual boundary areas were presented and the series Visiting Solvakia introduced the potential reader to the history and present of the natural historic regions. All books are prepared not only in the Slovak language but also in several foreign languages. Precisely the translations of our guidebooks represent the principal aim of our activities based in the idea to make the attractiveness of Slovakia accessible also to tourists coming from abroad. The new series Knapsacked Travel in Slovakia has been prepared with similar intention. As the title of the series suggests, the guidebooks are intended for hikers above all. They contain descriptions of tours, maps illustrating the routes, altitude profiles, classification by exactness and time schedules complemented by photographs of the typical sceneries in most cases. Introduction to the individual books in this series also contains general information, basic characteristics of natural setting of the area in question, and a map of the region with indicated situation of the individual tours. The guidebook also highlights natural landmarks and special points of interests, options to trips, practical information and a register of the most important hiking points. All recommended tours were written leaning on personal experience of the authors

and collaborators. The first chapter briefly characterizes the natural conditions of the territory in question. A map of the region in scale 1:500 000, which contains the numbered described hiking routes follows. Then comes the detailed description of the individual routes. 45 routes are classified, described and mapped in this book.
