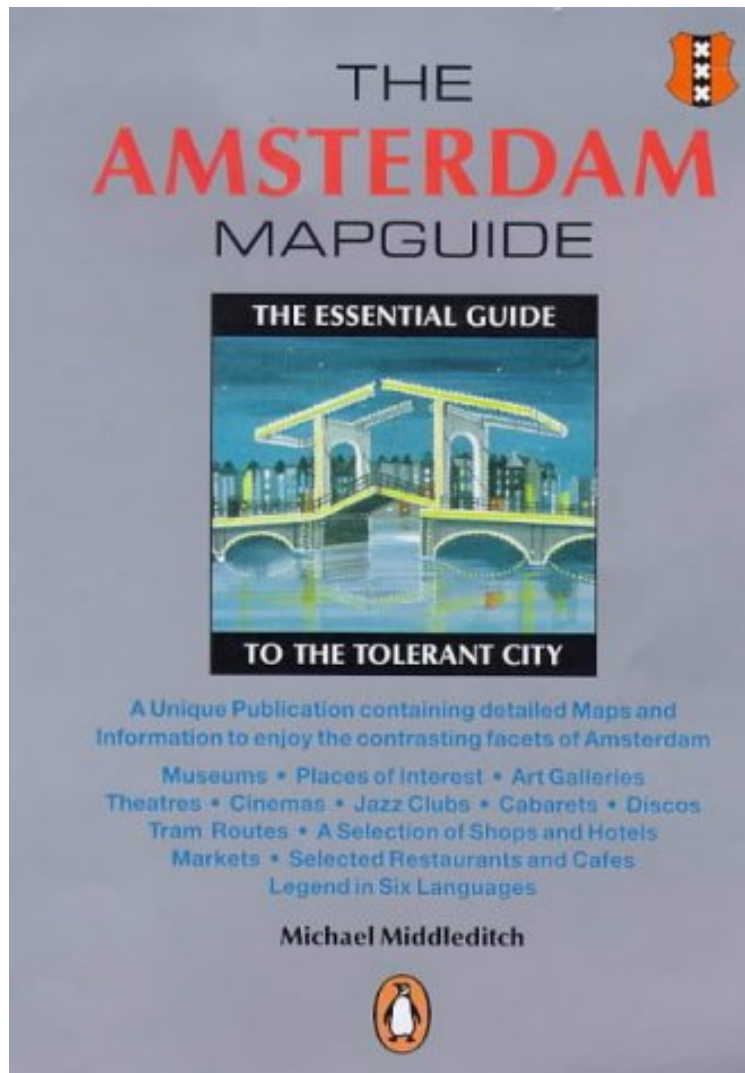

It is so much better than any city map that I have ever used, that when I found out that there were others by the same author (cartographer?) I eventually bought them all, including the Amsterdam one. This guide is now quite a few years old, and not updated regularly like the London one was. However, since the streets have not changed in any major ways this is still a very nice mapguide to

have if you are going to Amsterdam. The map pages are so clearly laid out, and pack lots of useful information on to every page. When was the last time you saw a map that gave credit to the author? Though I have never met Michael Middleditch, because I have enjoyed his mapguides so much (mainly the London one, since we have been there so many times), when I read that he passed away on Christmas Day 2012 it felt like a relative had passed away. Carter Ross It's only 32 pages, but Middleditch does a nice job of cramming a lot of information into a tight space. The maps outline most of the central city and provide a very nice level of detail. The rundown of places of interest, restaurants, hotel, etc. are sparse, but well chosen. By no means does The Amsterdam Mapguide substitute for a solid guidebook, but it is easy to carry around and helpful for business travelers or others on a short trip through the city looking to get around and to find someplace interesting to fill a spare afternoon or two.
