It is a convenient size for a purse and it covers the cental portion of London, though very little of the outlying districts. It doesn't go north of the Angel underground stop to the North, Harrod's to the west, or Putney to the southwest, and hasn't been updated to include the Tate Modern or the Globe on the Southwark side of the river. I am now forced to buy another mapguide, but really wish Penguin would put out another copy of this handy little book.

With 32 pages of four-color maps fully marked with underground stations and bus routes, markets, places of interest, theaters, museums, and selected pubs, The Penguin London Mapguide is a unique and versatile handbook.
