From *Library Journal* Two competent guidebooks from a small, relatively new, publisher. Both are personal in approach, but differ in style and format. Levi conveys a great amount of Alaska frontier humor: bear and mosquito stories (he advises putting rocks in childrens' shoes to keep the latter from carrying them off, and describes moose as having the "IQ of a turnip"). His audience is the "soft adventurers," and his book is more lively reading than most Alaskan guidebooks. It complements the standard works issued by the Alaska Northwest Publishing Company. The Rogers' book resembles a first-person travel narrative. Their particular strength is church architecture. The authors provide lodging and restaurant recommendations, along with approximate prices. Surprisingly, they only mention one airline to Portugal, which they praise lavishly. The Azores and Madeira are included. There are simple but useful maps, a brief glossary, and a chronology of Portuguese history that stops, mysteriously, at 1974.
