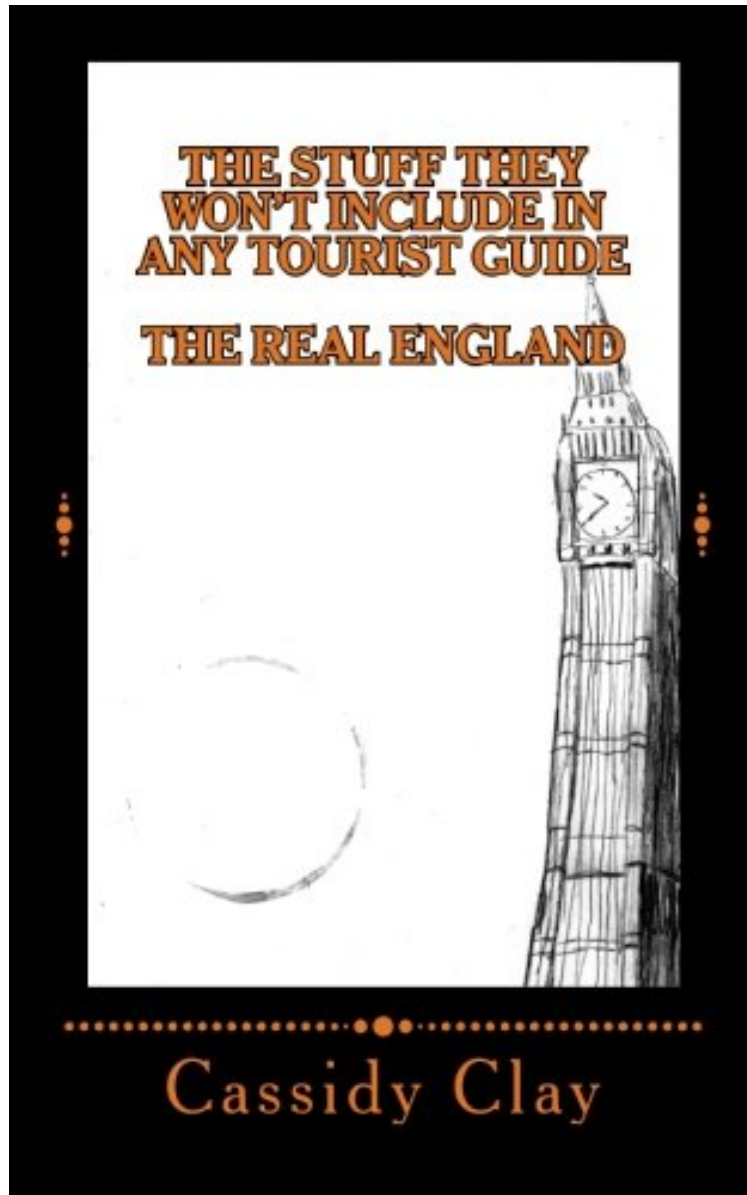


(Download) The Stuff They Won't Include in Any Tourist Guide: The Real England (Volume 1)
