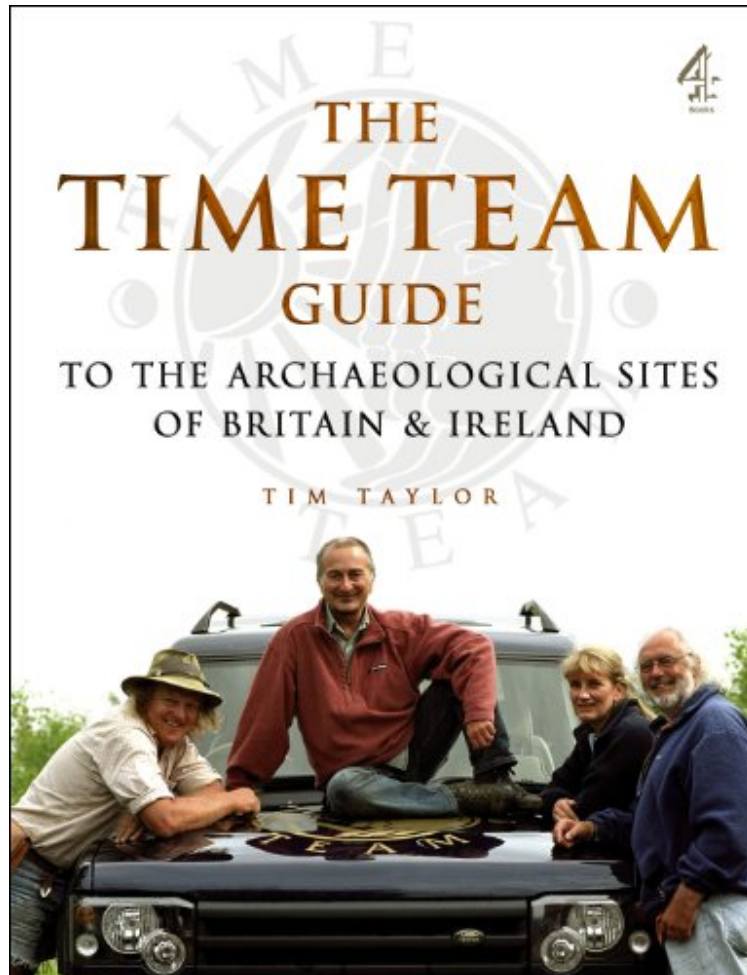

I also appreciate the dates associated with each site. This is not meant to be a book for serious scholars. Some sites listed only offer a short two or three paragraph description. Others are a little more in-depth. There are plenty of photographs, both aerial and close-up, depicting the significance of each site. If you like the "Time Team" TV program, are just interested in history learned from archaeology, or perhaps planning to travel to the British Isles to experience history for yourself, this is a great book.
