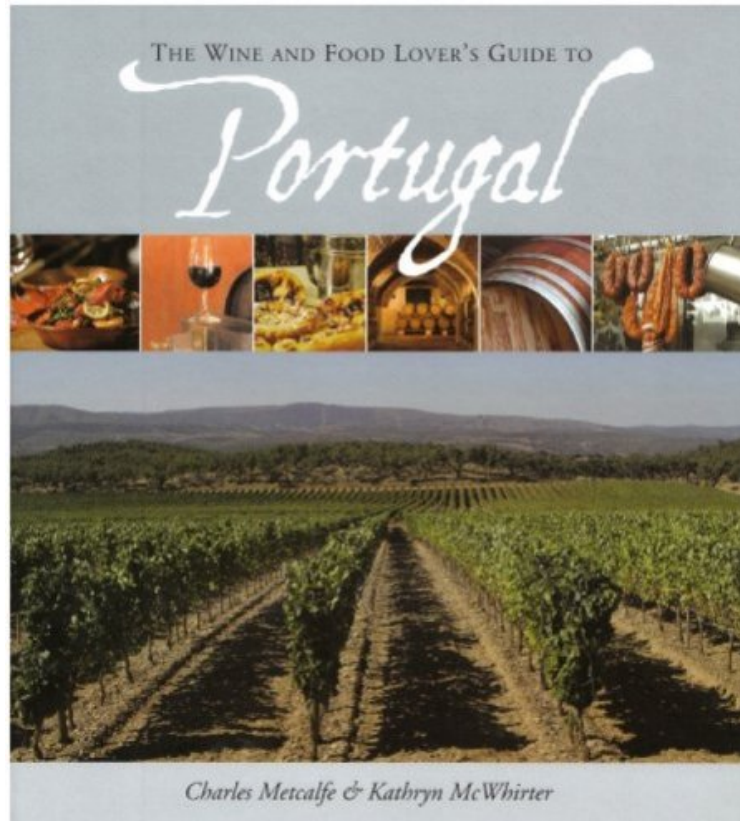

But the general travel guides I've looked at haven't really given me a good sense of how to plan the trip I want to take. As wine is part of the attraction for me, this guide looked interesting.Not surprisingly, this book has a lot to say about the food and wine of Portugal. But it also gives a good sense of place, the lay of the land, and the landscape and culture to expect. The charm of the country comes through. On the other hand, the authors are honest when a town isn't all that charming, and tell you not to expect much from it.It should be noted that this book is physically bigger than a typical travel guide, and more for planning a trip than sticking in your pocket for instant reference.
