are excellent. (It's just like your "London A-Z" ...plus recommendations.) Much more useful/informative than either Frommer's or (surprisingly) Lonely Planet, which both often lack perspective because of their target traveler-markets. This edition has misinformation on the hours of almost every church I've tried to visit. The guide will say it's open on Saturday and it's not; it will say that there are afternoon hours when there aren't, or they'll be closing several hours before the guide says they close. When you trek halfway across the city (on foot in 90-degree heat) to see something and find it closed repeatedly, it gets pretty frustrating. Most issues seem to be with summer hours.
